National Collegiate Taekwondo Association Athlete Selection Procedures 2021 (2022) Summer World University Games

Dec. 1, 2021

I. SELECTION SYSTEM

A. Provide the minimum eligibility requirements for an athlete to be considered for nomination to the Team:

1. Must be a U.S. citizen by the time of their entry into 2021 (2022) US Collegiate Taekwondo Team Trials for poomsae.
2. Per IF standards, athletes must be black belts.
3. Only the competitors who satisfy the following conditions may take part in a FISU sporting event:
 - Be a national of the country they represent;
 - Be 18-26 years old (athlete's age on Dec. 31, 2022);
 - Students who are officially registered for and pursuing at least a **half-time** course of study at a university or similar institute whose status as a university is recognized by the appropriate national academic authority of their country;
 - Former students of the institutions mentioned in the third bullet point who have obtained their academic degree or diploma in the year preceding the event (i.e. 2020, 2021 or 2022).

B. Provide a brief summary outlining how an athlete is selected as a nominee to the Team.

The 2021(2022) Collegiate Team Trials will be held to determine the 2021 (2022) Summer World University Games (SWUG) Taekwondo team nominees. The date of this event will be Feb 18, 2022, and the venue will be the USA Taekwondo Center for Excellence in Colorado Springs, CO. Details of this competition will be posted at the NCTA website (ncta-usa.com).

One male individual, one female individual, one mixed pair (one male, one female), one male team (3 athletes) and one female team (3 athletes) will be selected at the team trials. Each division entrant will progress through a preliminary elimination round (20 or more entrants) where each entrant will perform two recognized poomsae. The top 50% of entrants will then advance through a semifinal elimination round (9-19 entrants), where each entrant will perform two different recognized poomsae. Finally, the top 8 entrants will compete in a final round where each entrant will compete with 1 recognized poomsae and 1 freestyle poomsae. The entrants with the highest total score across both poomsae in the final round will serve as the 2021 (2022) Summer World University Games Taekwondo team nominees. The entrant in second place (the runner up) will be considered the B-team member and alternate should the winner not be able to serve as the 2021 (2022) SWUG team member.

If neither the 1st place nor the 2nd place entrant from the poomsae team trials is able to serve on the 2021 (2022) SWUG team, then it will be at the discretion of a selection committee whether or not the entrant for said division will be included on the US team competing at the 2021 (2022) SWUG. The selection committee will consist of: the NCTA President, a poomsae athlete representative, and a poomsae coaching representative.

C. Tryout Events:

1. Provide the event names, dates and location of all trials, events and/or camps to be used as part of the selection process.

There will not be any tryout events (i.e. camps or competition) for the 2021(2022) Summer World University Games Taekwondo team.

D. Provide a comprehensive, step-by-step description of the method that explains how athletes will go through the selection process to become team nominees.

Representatives in the Individual Male, Individual Female, Mixed Pair (1 male, 1 female), Male Team (3 athletes) and Female Team (3 athletes) divisions will be selected:

1. Athletes for each of the above referenced divisions will be selected at the team trials. Each entrant will progress through a preliminary elimination round (20 or more entrants) where each entrant will perform two recognized

poomsae. The top 50% of entrants will then advance through a semifinal elimination round (9-19 entrants), where each entrant will perform two different recognized poomsae. Finally, the top 8 entrants will compete in a final round where each entrant will compete with 1 recognized poomsae and 1 freestyle poomsae. The entrants with the highest total score across both poomsae in the final round will serve as the 2021 (2022) Summer World University Games Taekwondo team nominees.

2. Seeding for all divisions will be random in the initial round. Subsequent rounds will be contested in reverse rank order, i.e. the first place finisher from the previous round will go last.

II. DISCRETIONARY SELECTION

Discretionary selection (wild cards) is not necessary as this is an open event for all athletes meeting the eligibility requirements.

III. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

Provide reasons that an athlete can be removed prior to Team Nomination approval by the NCTA:

A. An athlete nominee may be removed from the 2021 (2022) Summer World University Games Taekwondo team or from any step of the process for selecting the team if she/he violates the NCTA Code of Conduct (Appendix A).

B. An athlete nominee may be removed from the 2021 (2022) Summer World University Games Taekwondo team or from any step of the process for selecting the team if she/he violates WADA, USADA, FISU, WT or USOPC anti-doping regulations or policies.

C. An athlete may withdraw or be removed from nomination to the 2021 (2022) Summer World University Games Taekwondo team in the event of injury or illness, which inhibits peak performance as certified by NCTA medical staff prior to nomination to the team.

Provide reasons that an athlete can be removed after Team Nomination approval by the NCTA:

An NCTA-approved team member may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by the NCTA:

- D. Voluntary withdrawal;
- E. Injury or illness as certified by the NCTA physician (or medical staff);
- F. Violation of the NCTA's Code of Conduct;
- G. Violation of WADA, USADA, FISU, WT or USOPC anti-doping regulations or policies.

IV. REPLACEMENT OF ATHLETES

Describe the process by which replacement athletes will be identified:

The poomsae winners will serve as the 2021(2022) Summer World University Games Taekwondo team nominees. The entrants in second place (the runner up) in the poomsae team trials will be considered the B-team member and alternate should the winners not be able to serve as the 2021 SWUG team members.

If neither the 1st place nor the 2nd place entrant from the poomsae team trials is able to serve on the 2021 (2022) SWUG team, then it will be at the discretion of a committee which includes the NCTA president, a poomsae athlete representative and a poomsae coach representative whether or not an entrant for said division will be included on the US team competing at the 2021 (2022) SWUG.

Appendix A: National Collegiate Taekwondo Association Code of Conduct

The following outline is the Code of Conduct for the National Collegiate Taekwondo Association. The Code is for all athletes, coaches, tournament committee members, referees, and staff members to fully abide by when participating in any and all NCTA event(s). Failure to comply with the following guidelines can result in the removal from an event, dismissal from future NCTA events, and/or the complete suspension from participation as a competitor, coach or staff member in future NCTA events.

1. One will act in a manner, consistent with the spirit of fair play and responsible conduct.
2. One will acknowledge, respect and adhere to the authority of NCTA Taekwondo appointed event staff, tournament staff, and team leader(s) if necessary.
3. One will fully comply with the NCTA, USA Taekwondo, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), and the World Taekwondo (WT) uniform requirement.
4. One will maintain an appropriate level of fitness to promote optimal athletic performance.
5. One will refrain from the excessive use of performance-limiting drugs, including, but not limited to, tobacco and alcohol.
6. One will refrain from using any substance on the Olympic Movement Anti-Doping Code, as enforced by USADA.
7. One will abide by the policies and rules established by the NCTA, USA Taekwondo, the USOPC and World Taekwondo (WT).
8. One will respect others, including coaches, competitors, officials, and spectators.
9. One will not engage in, nor tolerate, any form of verbal, physical or sexual abuse.
10. One will respect the property of others.
11. One will refrain from illegal or inappropriate behavior that would deter from a positive image of oneself and the NCTA.
12. One will maintain a positive attitude and act in a way that will bring honor to oneself, the staff, the sport of Taekwondo, the NCTA, and the United States of America.
13. One will remember that I am an ambassador of the NCTA, my country and the Olympic movement.

The National Collegiate Taekwondo Association recognizes that this Code does not establish a comprehensive set of rules that prescribes every aspect of appropriate behavior.
